Tech Tips

It's unfortunate that some people feel scamming others is OK. Scammers may tell you to send a certain amount of money to them and they will send triple the amount of money back to you. You may receive a call from someone pretending to be a grandchild and in jail needing bail money. Or Microsoft calls to tell you your computer has viruses on it. Whatever the call maybe, do not let your guard down and never give personal information to anyone over the phone. When you receive these calls simply

HANG UP!

Here are a few more examples of scams to be aware of. Some of these will sound silly, but people do fall for them.

- Nobody, but nobody, is going to give you half of \$80 million to help them liberate the funds of a deceased millionaire...from Nigeria or anywhere else.
- Microsoft doesn't care enough about you to contact you directly to let you know you have a virus or any other computer issues.
- The FBI, IRS or any of the other alphabet government agencies will never contact you by email to let you know they are investigating you for anything no matter how guilty you may feel.

- When someone sends you some shocking e-mail and suggests that you pass it on, don't. At least not until you've first confirmed its truth at snopes.com, the Internet's authority on e-mailed myths. This includes get-rich schemes, Microsoft/AOL cash giveaways, etc.
- When you get an e-mail message from eBay or your bank, claiming that you have an account problem or a question from a buyer, it's probably a "phishing scam" intended to trick you into typing your password. Don't click the link in the message. If in doubt, go into your browser and type the web site address manually.
- No reputable company can know or have any idea that you have computer issues without first gaining access to your computer. Anyone who calls, emails or contacts you in any way is scamming you and will charge you a lot to solve problems that they cause themselves.

If you fall victim to fraud, don't beat yourself up about it. Report it to the authorities, make careful notes and save the evidence if there is any, cut your losses, **DON'T BLAME YOURSELF** - you are not the first and you won't be the last. Finally, don't expect too much. It is unfortunate but the odds of getting your money back are pretty slim.
